




Abstract

This publication provides a list of geographical-political entities of the world and associated standard codes. These entities include independent states, dependent areas, areas of quasi-independence, noncontiguous territories, possessions without population, areas with special sovereignty associations, areas without sovereignty, political regimes not recognized by the United States, and outlying areas of the United States.

ANNOUNCING THE STANDARD FOR

Federal Information Processing Standards Publications are issued by the National Bureau of Standards pursuant to the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949 as amended, Public Law 89-306 (79 Stat. 1127), and as implemented by Executive Order 11717 (38 FR 12315, dated May 11, 1973), and Part 6 of Title 15 CFR (Code of Federal Regulations).

Name of Standard. Countries, Dependencies, and Areas of Special Sovereignty (FIPS 10-1).

Category of Standard. Federal General Data Standard, Representations and Codes.

Explanation. This standard sets forth a list of basic geographical-political entities and a code structure that identifies each entity. Basic entities are defined as:

- a. Independent states.
- b. Dependent areas.
- c. Areas of quasi-independence, noncontiguous territories, possessions without population, areas with special sovereignty associations, and areas without sovereignty.
- d. Political regimes not recognized by the United States.
- e. Outlying areas of the United States, including islands in dispute.

Each basic entity includes all of its first-order subdivisions (examples, United States includes Hawaii and Alaska; Portugal includes the Azores and Madeira Islands). This list of basic entities provides complete coverage of the Earth's land masses without overlap or duplication in coverage.

Approving Authority. The initial version of the standard was approved by the Office of Management and Budget. Changes are provided in accordance with par. 6.9, Part 6 of Title 15 CFR.

Maintenance Agency: Department of State, Office of the Geographer, Room 8742, Washington, D.C. 20520.

Questions concerning the list of entities and codes should be addressed to the Maintenance Agency. The Maintenance Agency will provide changes as they occur to the National Bureau of Standards. These could include changes in names of entities, their definitions or codes. Users of this FIPS PUB who need to be notified of these changes in the interim and prior to the next revision of this standard can complete the Change Request Form included in the back of this publication and return it as indicated to the National Bureau of Standards. Change notices will be issued by NBS based upon the information provided by the Department of State.

Cross Index. None.

Applicability. This standard will be prescribed for the interchange of formatted machine sensible coded data between and among agencies and between agencies and the public, to include industry

and local governments. Use within agency data systems is encouraged when such use contributes to operational benefits, efficiency, or economy.

Implementation Schedule. The earlier version of this standard (FIPS 10) became effective on January 1, 1971. Changes provided by this revision can be implemented immediately.

In those instances where data interchange is based upon reporting requirements in Federal or department wide programs, the implementation of this standard and changes needs to be coordinated by the organization having the authority to impose the reporting requirement. Exceptions, deferments and revisions to this standard will be considered under the provisions of par. 6.8, Part 6 of Title 15 CFR.

Specifications. Federal Information Processing Standard 10-1 (FIPS 10-1), Countries, Dependencies, and Areas of Special Sovereignty, (affixed).

Qualifications. This standard is not intended to cause a basic upheaval of systems that do not use a geographical-political basis for subdividing the world. On the other hand, if these systems must combine two or more sovereign nations as a single entity, there must be a clear indication of this fact and the combination must not be represented as being merely the largest entity. In other words, if any system is to continue to use nonstandard entities, each such nonstandard entity must clearly identify the standard entities that comprise it.

Work is continuing at the American National Standards and the International Organization for Standards levels to develop voluntary industry standards for country codes. When available, these voluntary standards will be evaluated to determine if they meet Federal requirements and their potential adoption for Federal use.




