





These entities include independent states, dependent areas, areas of quasi-independence, noncontiguous territories, possessions without population, areas with special sovereignty associations, areas without sovereignty, political regimes not recognized by the United States, and outlying areas of the United States.

Federal Information Processing Standards Publications are issued by the National Bureau of Standards pursuant to the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949, as amended, Public Law 89-306 (79 Stat. 1127), Executive Order 11717 (38 FR 12315, dated May 11, 1973), and Part 6 of Title 15 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR).

Name of Standard. Countries, Dependencies, and Areas of Special Sovereignty (FIPS 10-2).

Category of Standard. Federal General Data Standard, Representations and Codes.

Explanation. This standard sets forth a list of basic geographical-political entities and a code structure that identifies each entity. Basic entities are defined as:

- a. Independent states.
- b. Dependent areas.
- c. Areas of quasi-independence, noncontiguous territories, possessions without population, areas with special sovereignty associations, and areas without sovereignty.
- d. Political regimes not recognized by the United States.
- e. Outlying areas of the United States, including islands in dispute.

Each basic entity includes all of its first-order subdivisions (examples, United States includes Hawaii and Alaska; Portugal includes the Azores and Madeira Islands). This list of basic entities provides complete coverage of the Earth's land masses without overlap or duplication in coverage.

Approving Authority. Secretary of Commerce.

Maintenance Agency. Department of State, Office of the Geographer, Room 8742, Washington, D.C. 20520.

Questions concerning the list of entities and codes should be addressed to the Maintenance Agency. The Maintenance Agency will provide changes as they occur to the National Bureau of Standards. These include changes in names of entities (as approved by the U.S. Board on Geographic Names), their definitions or codes. Users of this standard who need to be notified of changes in the interim period prior to the next revision and publication of this standard can complete the Change Request Form provided in this publication and forward it as indicated to the NBS Office of ADP Standards Management, Washington, D.C. 20234. Change notices will be issued by NBS based upon the change information provided by the Department of State.

Cross Index. American National Standard Z39.27-1976, Structure for the Representation of Names of Countries of the World for Information Interchange, and ISO 3166, Codes for the Representation of Names of Countries.

Applicability. This standard is prescribed for the interchange of data between and among agencies and between agencies and the public, to include industry, and state and local governments. Use within agency data systems is encouraged when such use contributes to operational benefits, efficiency, or economy. (See Qualifications Section below.)

Implementation Schedule. The earlier version of this standard (FIPS 10-1) became effective on June 15, 1974. Changes provided by this revision can be implemented immediately.

In those instances where data interchange is based upon reporting requirements in Federal or department wide programs, the implementation of this standard and changes must be coordinated in advance with the organization having the authority to prescribe the reporting requirements. Exceptions, deferments and revisions to this standard will be considered under the provisions of sec. 6.8, Part 6 of Title 15 CFR.

Specifications. Federal Information Processing Standard 10-2 (FIPS 10-2), Countries, Dependencies, and Areas of Special Sovereignty (affixed).

Qualifications. On December 5, 1974, the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) adopted an international standard for country codes (ISO Standard 3166). The codes contained in this standard are currently being widely implemented in the international interchange of data in applications involving statistics, banking, transportation, energy, patents and communications.

ISO Standard 3166 was also adopted as a voluntary industry standard (Z39.27-1976) on January 15, 1976 by the American National Standards Institute.

It is recognized that many Federal Government applications involving international exchange of data can benefit from the use of the ISO/ANSI standard codes rather than using the FIPS 10 codes which were developed and implemented as Federal standards prior to the existence of either national or international standards. In these cases, Federal agencies may use the ISO/ANSI codes without obtaining an exception.

The ISO/ANSI standard codes are being considered for Federal adoption in addition to the codes provided in this FIPS PUB. A list of the ISO/ANSI codes may be obtained from the NBS Office of ADP Standards Management, Institute for Computer Sciences and Technology, National Bureau of Standards, Washington, D.C. 20234. Reference NBS Letter Circular 1067 on "Codes for the Names of Countries."
